Division 14 2021-22 budget allocations

Currumbin Hills Park playground upgrade, Currumbin Waters

Combined Division 14 and whole-ofcity funding will be used to upgrade Currumbin Hills Park during the 2021-22 Financial Year. Works will include replacing two out of the three existing basketball courts with a new outdoor gym and upgrading the remaining basketball court. A new shelter and seating will also be installed as part of this project.

Giltrap Park playground upgrade, Kirra

Playground upgrade works at Giltrap Park are planned for Jan-Feb 2022 as part of the Division 14 2021-22 budget allocation. Works will include removal of the stand only swing and returning the area to turf; and extending the existing play area to include a new carousel and see-saw. The old shade structures which have already been removed will be replaced with a new larger shade structure to cover the upgraded playground area.

Tree planting

The following tree planting projects have been planned for Division 14 over the next 12 months:

- Removal and replacement of African Tulip Trees at Tugun Rugby League Club, Boyd Street.
- Bulk tree planting of 110 trees for Valley Drive, Tallebudgera planned for November 2021.

• Bulk tree planting of 110 trees for Kirra and Coolangatta planned for March 2022.

Division 14 2021-22 Projects

The following Division 14 projects have been funded from the whole-of-city Budget for 2021-22;

- Renewal of the existing timber 'Boyd's Bridge' located on Currumbin Creek Road, Currumbin Valley
- Remediation of landslips on Ducats Road, Tallebudgera
- Reconstruction of Johnston Street, Bilinga
- New bridge installation across Teemangum Street to replace the old culverts and relocating existing bus stops 300589 & 300590 further north of the current locations.

Currumbin State School road safety

The City has a minor works project in place to implement traffic islands within the 'Kiss and Go' lane at Currumbin State School to improve road safety. Installation is anticipated late-July to early-August.

Cyclists dismount signage, Tugun

The City has installed larger 'Cyclists dismount' signage on the side of the bin at the intersection of Toolona Street and Golden Four Drive which should be more visible to cyclists and skateboarders. I'm appealing to cyclists and skateboarders to dismount before entering Tugun Village particularly along the stretch of footpath between Toolona Street and Wyberba Street as several of our senior residents use this footpath to attend the medical centre.

Our natural environment deserves protecting

As our coast population increases, pressure on our green and open space also increases.

The City, in partnership with private land holders and the State Government, spends millions every year to preserve our natural assets.

The recent 2021-22 budget includes \$161 million for our parks, natural areas, and environmental conservation.

Of this, \$145.29 million will be invested in parks, natural areas, and recreation, with a further \$14.44 million specific for environmental conservation.

Key initiatives for 2021-22 include:

- \$11 million to commence a program of acquiring up to 40 priority acquisition sites (totalling 3515 hectares) across the city to ensure better wildlife corridor linkages (the first seven sites will be targeted in 2021-22)
- \$7.9 million to manage over 13,000 hectares of bushland across the city
- \$2.47 million to maintain bushfire management including hazard reduction burns, fire management planning, fire breaks, fire trail construction and vegetation management
- \$200,850 to develop a priority species program and support implementation of Koala Conservation Plan
- \$150,400 toward developing collaborative monitoring and reporting arrangements on the health, quality, and protection of our City's natural assets to deliver State of the Environment-type reporting; and
- \$111,900 to implement the environmental offset program for ongoing protection of native vegetation

I trust Gold Coasters won't object to paying an extra \$2.50 into Open Space, including Koala Habitat, (Maintenance and Enhancement Separate Charge) to support these critical land purchases. This charge added to the existing \$1 per annum koala habitat program.
