Division 14 Budget 2019-20 – With the recent adoption of the City Budget, here's a list of how Division 14's discretionary budget of \$912, 385 has been allocated:

Whole of City funding towards Division 14 projects includes:

- Road reconstruction works to repair roads at the end of their useful life including Golden Four Drive, Tugun; and Boundary, Ward and Petrie Streets, Coolangatta
- Footbridge replacement at Coplick Family Sports Park, Tallebudgera
- Kirra Point boardwalk renewal
- Extend Bermuda Street through to Tallebudgera Creek Road, Tallebudgera to improve safety and reduce traffic congestion

Local Area Works

Len Wort Park – At my request, the City will be installing timber bollards to replace the temporary rocks beneath the Wayne 'Rabbit' Bartholomew Bridge which is considered high risk of vandalism and to deter the lighting of fires beneath the bridge.

Bilinga dune vegetation trimming and planting works -

The City is undertaking beach maintenance works along Pacific Parade (Archer Street and Mills Street), Bilinga. Stage one is complete and included the selective removal of Cottonwood trees, Coastal tea-tree and dead trees. Stage two has commenced and will involve uplifting the tree canopy adjacent to the park, weed control, and revegetation with suitable coastal species to replace lost canopy due to vandalism. This project is due to be completed by October.

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Sewer main upgrade - The City will be constructing a new sewer main under its infrastructure renewal program from Sewer Pump Station B20 at Gold Coast Highway, Currumbin. Construction of the 630 metres of sewer main commenced on Wednesday 19 June and is expected to be completed within eight weeks (weather permitting). Works will generally take place Monday to Friday between 7am and 5pm. It is expected that the work will be restricted to the road reserve however partial road closures may be necessary and motorists and pedestrians are urged to follow the directions of traffic control officers.

Bike lane markings – New bike lane markings have been installed along Golden Four Drive in Tugun Village.

Speed Awareness Devices – Speed Awareness Devices will soon be deployed in the following streets for four months; Galleon Way, Currumbin Waters; Golden Four Drive and Toolona Street, Tugun; and Miles Street, Coolangatta.

Roadside hazard removal – Commencing 1 July for three weeks, the Department of Transport and Main Roads will be removing roadside hazards, including trees and vegetation within the clear zone of the centre median on the Gold Coast Highway, directly north of Terminal Drive. Once the clearing has been completed, native grasses will be planted in the centre median. Works will take place between 7am and 5pm Monday to Friday, with lane closures only occurring outside of peak hours.

Kirra Boardwalk renewal project – The City of Gold Coast will soon be commencing a project to renew the iconic Kirra Boardwalk. Built in 2001, the popular wooden structure is reaching the end of its design life. The renewal project will involve a complete removal of the existing boardwalk and

sub-structure, installation of concrete piers and precast architectural finished concrete deck and reinstallation of the existing handrail. This type of structure will improve the load capabilities and ensure the safety of pedestrians. The robust concrete structure will ensure the boardwalk is able to withstand the environmental impacts of the beachfront location, and provide a maximum life span of 100 years.

The renewal project is expected to commence in September 2019. Works will take place Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm. The wooden boardwalk and adjacent footpath will be closed for up to five months. A pedestrian detour and alternative pedestrian paths will be provided along Marine Parade. Beach access from the stairs along the boardwalk will also be temporarily closed during construction. Traffic management and lane closures will be in place.

Wyberba Street Parklands, new public amenities - The City of Gold Coast will be replacing the existing public amenities at Wyberba Street Parklands with a new facility in response to public need and condition of the current facility. Wyberba Street Parklands is a very popular park that includes features such as playgrounds, picnic facilities and a lifeguard patrolled beach.

The open and airy design of the new public amenity is consistent with other new facilities across the Gold Coast and will include stalls for male, female, unisex persons with a disability and a fully accessible unisex change room. During construction, two temporary portable toilets will be located at Wyberba Parkland for 14 weeks from 29 April to 5 August for public use.

As part of the amenities renewal, the beach shower located at the nearest beach entrance will be upgraded to a double beach accessible shower.

Construction commenced in April with a construction period of three to four months.
